The Value of Communication Skills



Having strong communication skills benefits all aspects of life, from professional to personal to everything in between. All business transactions are the result of communication.

Good communication skills are required to enable others and yourself to comprehend information more accurately and quickly.

Poor communication skills, on the other hand, result in frequent misunderstanding and frustration.

How to Enhance Your Communication Capabilities
Here are some things to keep in mind if you want to improve your ability to communicate effectively with others:

1) Listening carefully

It is critical to be a good listener in order to become a good communicator. It's critical to practice active listening, which is paying close attention to what people are saying and clarifying any ambiguities by rephrasing their inquiries for better comprehension.

2) Conciseness

Use as few words as possible to convey your message. Don't waste time with filler words; instead, get right to the point.

The listener will tune out or be unsure of what you're talking about if you ramble.

Excessive talking and the use of terminology that may cause confusion in the audience should be avoided.

3) Use of body language

When talking with others, it is critical to use good body language, maintain eye contact, make hand gestures, and listen to the tone of your voice. A relaxed body stance combined with a kind tone will help you appear approachable to others.

In communication, it's crucial to make eye contact with the other person to show that you're paying attention to what they're saying. However, avoid staring at the person, as this may make him or her uncomfortable.

4) Self-assurance

Be self-assured in what you say and in your dealings with others. Maintaining eye contact, maintaining a calm body stance, and speaking with precision can all help you feel more secure. Make sure your words don't sound like inquiries, and don't try to come across as forceful or disparaging.

5) Inquisitiveness

When you disagree with what someone else says, whether it's an employer, a coworker, or a friend, it's crucial to sympathise with their point of view rather than merely trying to get your point over. Respect other people's opinions and never belittle those who disagree with you.

6) Be respectful

Respecting what others have to say and acknowledging them is a vital component of communication. Paying attention to what they have to say, using their name, and not being distracted are all examples of being respectful. Respecting people makes the other person feel valued, which leads to a more open and fruitful interaction.

7) Choosing the right medium

There are numerous types of communication to choose from; it's crucial to pick the proper one. For example, speaking with someone in person about significant issues (layoffs, wage changes, etc.) is preferable to sending an email.

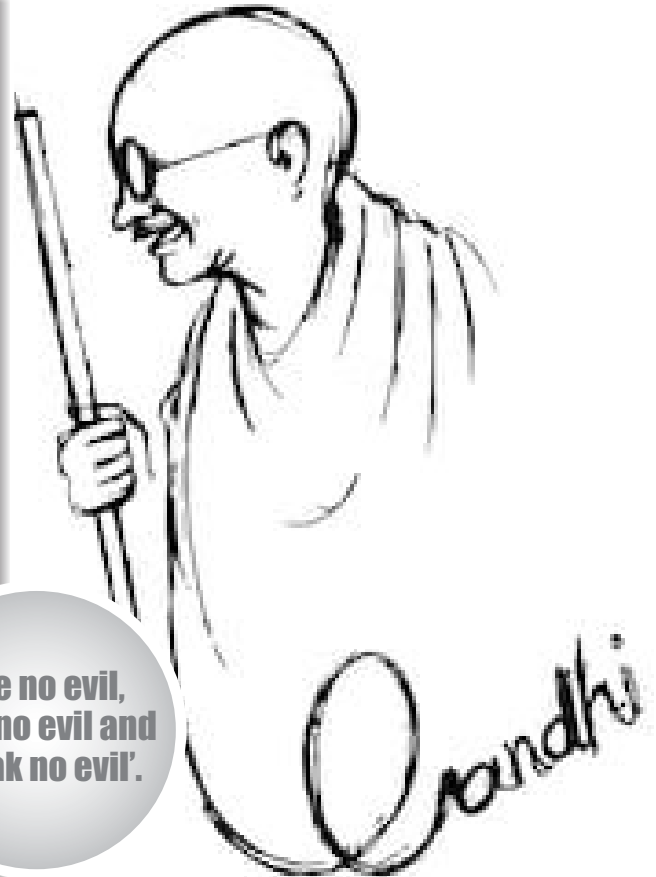

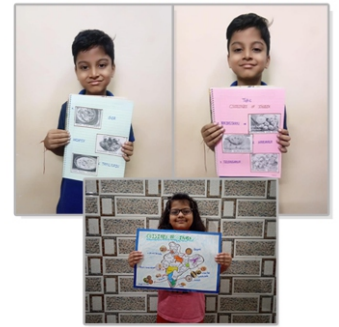
बताना, इत्यादि हिंदी गतिविधियों का छात्रों के लिए समावेश किया गया।

Since NASA's inception in 1958, astronauts have landed on the moon, parked a robot-controlled rover on Mars, and discovered thousands of exoplanets - planets that orbit stars

pandemic year, weird and wonderful space discoveries flooded in from above, with astronomers pulling back the curtain on monster black holes, invisible magnetic mega-structures and a cosmic treasure trove of extraterrestrial planets.

As a reminder that the universe just gets stranger and stranger the farther you get from Earth, here are 5 of the most awesome, extreme and enigmatic space structures discovered in decade.

1. Possibility of life on Jupiter's moon

In a study released in 2017, researchers reported evidence of shifting tectonic plates on Jupiter's icy moon Europa, which has a balance of

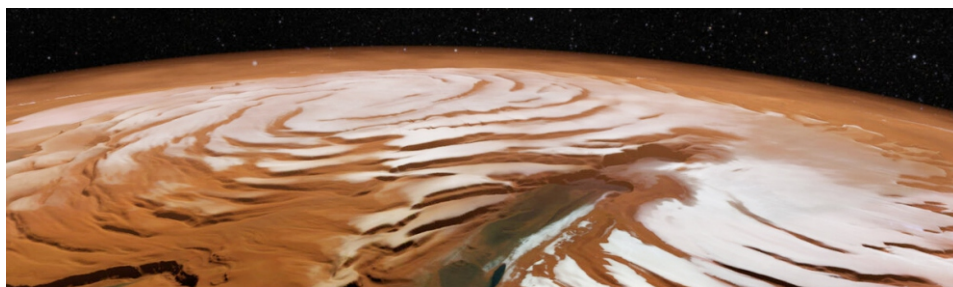
hydrogen and oxygen similar to Earth. These findings support the possibility that Europa could be hospitable to life. The ocean is frozen 10 miles deep, but future missions might

try to discover if the body of water is warm enough beneath the surface to support life.



2. The Ultra-rare Planet in Orion's Nose

Don't sneeze, Orion! This year, scientists found compelling evidence that the rarest type of planet in the universe — a single world orbiting three stars simultaneously — is perched on the tip of the hunter constellation's great, gassy nose.



In 2016, an ice layer bigger than New Mexico was discovered on Mars. The layer, which sits somewhere under 3

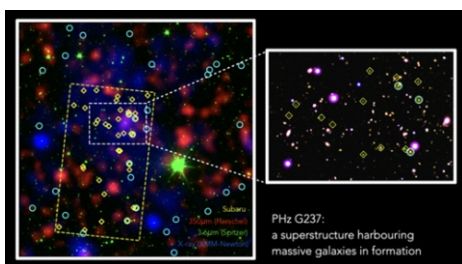
to 33 feet of soil, is thought to be an accessible spot for future exploration. The researchers who made the discovery were led by Cassie Stuurman of the Institute for Geophysics at the University of Texas.

4. The Synestia Theory

About 4.5 billion years ago, Earth may have been a "synestia," a short-lived hot mass that can be donut-shaped, according to a 2017 study in the Journal of Geophysical Research: Planets. Scientists believe these celestial objects are formed after two planet-sized bodies collide, which may be how the moon was formed.



5. A massive "Shipyard" of Ancient Galaxies



In an Oct. 26 study in the journal *Astronomy & Astrophysics*, scientists shared the discovery of a

massive "shipyard" where galaxies are built, similar to the one our Milky Way grew up in. The giant structure, called a proto cluster, contains more than 60 galaxies and is 11 billion light-years from Earth, placing it in a part of the universe that is only 3 billion years old. Proto clusters like this one form in regions of space where long threads of gas, called filaments, crisscross,

providing a buffet of hydrogen for gravity to coalesce into stars and galaxies. The finding suggests that ancient proto clusters were far more efficient at assembling the foundations of the modern universe than researchers ever imagined.
